In late 2013, Ray Burley Productions asked four writers to each create a 15 minute play with four characters, at least one of whom was a tree. The works are diverse, but a tendril reaches from each through the others. This is our copse of *Four Tree Plays*.

Seeking Still uses trees as a metaphor for the isolation of being single, the feeling of being rooted in one spot by your fears, trauma, neuroses, and the quirks of your personality. It isn't about what it's like to be a tree. It's about what it's like to be human, using trees as a metaphor. Maybe you're just online dating to meet people. But maybe you're online dating because you're looking for someone to come to you, to be your perfection, because you're so fixed in one spot you can't even think about being someone else's perfection.

Tree Counsel arose out of a simple image of a man sitting under a tree, listening to church radio. What's that person like, and what happens when he meets someone very different from himself, but who is also drawn to the tree? This show explores the preconceptions and misconceptions we have about one another and how those can influence our relationships. *Sophistree* asks us to examine what motivates us to protect the environment, and more generally, what drives us to do anything about "making the world a better place." It examines how we choose to address personal and global problems given the impossibility of moral certitude. Today, we grapple with the biggest issues our species has ever faced, and at the same time face a torrential bombardment of often contradictory information. Moral certainty has never been more elusive, nor the need for action greater, than it is today.

Does It Make A Sound? reminds us that we are not alone on this planet. We share it with so many other life forms. How do those other life forms feel about humans, each other, themselves... if you consider others' feelings, you can't help but respect them a lot more.
